The Mary Garden at St. Brigid's Church

The Mary Garden is one of the more unique civic gardening projects maintained by the Lexington Field & Garden Club. A Mary Garden is a small garden for

contemplation that features a statue or shrine of the Virgin Mary and flowers, shrubs, and trees associated with her stories and legends. The practice began in the monasteries and convents of the Middle Ages, and was brought to St. Joseph's Church in Woods Hole, Massachusetts, in 1932.

The Mary Garden at St. Brigid's includes Vinca minor, Daffodils, Astilbe, Rhododendrons, Azaleas, Irises, Heuchera, Daylilies, and Hosta, as well as a bench for rest and contemplation.

This serene garden was tended for many years by LFGC's Wednesday Workshop group. It is currently maintained by steward Regina Sutton.
